





YOU MIGHT SEE JAYA IN THE PLAYGROUND

Don't run up to her as she will get scared, walk slowly.


Offer your hand for Jaya to smell. Tuck your fingers out of the way.









If you want to pat Jaya you must ask permission. Sometimes it will be okay for you to pat Jaya and sometimes it won't be okay.












Stroke her back from her neck towards her tail. Sometimes she will roll over and you can gently pat her tummy.








Wash your hands or use the hand sanitiser after patting Jaya.



You might see Jaya in Mrs Olivey's office.




She might listen to you read.















Jaya will not visit your classroom if you are scared of dogs.





Jaya is part of our school community, just like other members of our community, you must respect Jaya.




You must never feed Jaya or hug her or crowd her.
