Years 5 and 6 have continued to use their problem solving skills for the next stage of the Design Make and Innovate (DMI) project this week. Students are using the design processes and skills learnt last week to begin the construction of another bridge over one and a half days. The materials the students are using consist of 400 pop sticks, PVA glue and string. The bridge, when completed, needs to span 40cm and support 500 grams. All students continued to work well with their mentors from Cromer Campus and have shown some impressive engineering skills.

# • Social Committee/Fundraising

#### Easter Hat Parade

- Heather C. read minutes on behalf of Rachael
- Easter Hat parade made \$300 supported by local shops
- Each hamper value \$100 \$200
- Easter bunny sponsored parents concerned about the 'crazy eyes' that scared children
- Jason K. asked that we send a thank you certificate out to sponsors. Kim W. has already done this
- \$650 spent on Easter prizes sponsorship needed next time to reduce this cost

# School Disco

- Bakers Delight donated bread and hot cross buns
- Suggested that we sell iceblocks outside of hall, or soup in the winter. Inclusive of all families who cannot enter the disco
- Change the parents exit point at the disco, perhaps a "kiss and drop" area.
- There was no last dance announced for K-2 and parents were upset by this.
- Mark C. expressed concern about the number of people in the hall if all parents were invited
- Some parents were upset that they were not allowed to watch their children in the hall dancing
- Food was under-priced and not meeting costs

- Rachel A. suggested that there should be more food for parents waiting outside (jumping castles, glow sticks, cheese and biscuits boxes)

# Mother's Day

- Disappointment that we had mother's day gifts sold online, rather than in a stall, as it takes away from the children selecting their gift personally
- Cass D-H. asking for parents to help with preparing Mother's Day gifts this Friday 4<sup>th</sup>
- Stall next week Thursday 10th & Friday 11th May helpers needed
- Cass D-H will be sending out a flyer to advertise
- Marianna A. questioned how much paper was coming home
- Geoff A suggested we use an App to send out messages. Mark said that we have "Schoolzine"

# • Treasurer's Report

- No report presented
- Super and tax payments being lodged for this quarter by Cass D-H.

# • Uniform Shop

- Are still under construction. No Internet connection in the room, but making do. A couple of invoices for payment. P&C to move to 'Xero' accounting software.
- March sales \$3547 mostly EFT
- April sales (2 weeks) \$1216 mostly Flexi schools
- Plenty of stock, though run out of some sizes.
- Turnaround time is 6 weeks to 2 months. Don't have any other options and so few suppliers.
- Parents could pre-order clothes as there is such a delay. Olga is apologetic for the delay but this is out of her hands
- Mark C. to follow up on the Internet connection being down

# • Any Other business

- Jason K. raised the issue of Westfield Local Heroes grants program
- Lisa Cribb, parent of the school and volunteer brought this grant to Jason K.
- Lisa very happy to write the grant and Philip Haynes would work on the numbers of \$10 000 prize money
- Suggested that we nominate Cass D-H for her efforts with keeping the P&C alive, Carnivale and other school-wide events
- Promote social wellbeing, harmony, youth opportunity and inclusion
- Raised the issue that many of our students can't afford the registration fees for Nippers and other youth organisations

- The money could be used to sponsor students and pay for registration at Nippers or other clubs youth opportunity
- Is the P&C willing to back this initiative?
- Mark C. suggested that this aligned with DWPS core values
- Nominations close 16<sup>th</sup> May
- Kim W. asked how we would select students to make it equitable
- Marianna A. suggested that we could involve the DY soccer club
- Agreed that we need to consider all sports and interests groups
- P&C agreed that we would support the application

Sydney Ice Hockey Bears

- 100 tickets available to students in the community to raise awareness of ice hockey.
- How will we put the tickets out? Fundraising?
- Mark C. suggested sport groups get tickets for best and fairest player
- Could also be given out by class teachers
