#### Social Committee/Fundraising

#### Father's Day

### • Treasurer's Report

- \$2,070 banked from School Disco, plus \$371 in flexischools tickets.
- Profit & loss we pretty much broke even.
- Canteen is about \$800 ahead with some invoices to pay
- We need to look into better software such as MYOB and use the same software across all businesses (Canteen, Uniform Shop, etc) and have all staff trained in using software to make it easier to assess profit & loss.
- P&C Audit will be completed in the near future

### • Uniform Shop

- Sales \$2077, Flexischools \$1300
- Purchases have increased by around 20% since this time last year. Olga has requested to buy another cupboard to store the extra stock she has on hand. Committee has approved.

#### Canteen

- Canteen is pretty much breaking even. We still need volunteers, if anyone can help out please contact Kathie

### • Sustainability Update

- Moving towards a more sustainable canteen and school, Kathie is making various changes in the Canteen to help this. She has removed plastic drinking straws and is looking towards other changes such as switching to non pre-packaged popcorn, needs to sell the stock she has first.
- Juan, Elaine, Kathie and Cass visited Wheeler Heights Public School to see how their canteen and sustainability works. They have 4 bins: Recycling, Compost, Reusable Canteen Equipment and Landfill. Their canteen menu wis quite different to ours with food served in reusable containers which are returned to the canteen directly or placed in equipment binsand washed daily.

We would like to use Wheeler Heights as inspiration and something to aim towards but will start with small changes.

- Costing was done on Recycling Bins, will cost \$15 per bin, per week
