#### Design, Make and Innovate (DMI)

Design, Make and Innovate came to Dee Why Public School!

This week Years 5 and 6 students participated in their first 'Design Make and Innovate' workshop, which is an initiative of the Northern Beaches Learning Alliance connecting secondary students with primary students around the area. Students have been put into small cooperative learning groups and paired with Year 9 mentors from the Northern Beaches Secondary College (Cromer Campus).

Our students designed a bridge which would withstand 200g of weight out of 200 straws and tape. The bridge needed to span 40cm with no middle supports. Watching the students engage in this 2.5 hour workshop of questioning, designing, problem solving and de-briefing was wonderful. Conversations, critical thinking and teamwork were evident from all groups and some very impressive and successful bridges were designed. This is only the beginning of their project, students have another 3 sessions were they will continue to use their new knowledge of engineering to construct a bridge working within the constraints provided.

The six best prototype bridges, out of 14, will be displayed at Freshwater Senior Campus in an exhibition for all finalists from each school. All participating schools are invited to attend and view each other's designs and accompanying portfolios. The portfolio is similar to that of a high School Design Technology portfolio, which outlines the design process, and evaluation of design features.
