Start Smart Money Lessons

In week 2, classes from Year 1 to Year 6 all had a 45 minute lesson about money and the value of using it wisely.

Start Smart educators visited school on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday to deliver their informative and engaging lessons. The following is information from the Start Smart website which briefly explains the program and the reasons for teaching children about money and finance.

During term four, Year 1 all have a class shop and students are earning money (plastic!!) and learning about the value of coins and notes. They are also experiencing



the value in saving for something from the shop that they would like to own. Their teachers open the class shop for approximately 10 minutes once a week and students can then count the money in their money boxes and decide if they have enough to buy the item they want. Teachers encourage students to save for something they would really like to own. This means that purchases of higher valued items may be made by students only a couple of times a term as they need to save consistently for a longer time to buy items. If parents can donate small items to their child's class shop please feel free to drop in and talk to the Year 1 teachers about suitable items and to see the shop first hand.
