We've been busy swimming over the last week or so!

51 students from Years 2 – 6 are today going to complete the intensive 'learn to swim' program as part of the Dee Why Public School PDHPE curriculum. We have been amazed by the level of improvement in such a short space of time. Students who were initially fearful of hopping into the swimming pool are now growing in confidence in water skills. Other students are learning breathing and stroke techniques that enable them



to swim safely and for longer periods of time. We look forward to seeing ongoing improvement in swimming skills and water safety over the second week of the program.

DY Star Wristbands



As part of our PBL program students have the opportunity to earn DY Stars.

A DY Star is awarded to a student when they demonstrate a behaviour in line with our three school expectations: RESPECT, RESPONSIBILITY & PERSONAL BEST. Students can potentially earn several DY Stars in a week. Every DY Star a student earns, goes into a barrel. There is a barrel for K-2 students and a barrel for 3-6 students. On a Monday morning at assembly, the School Leaders roll out the barrels and lead the DY Star Raffle Draw. They pick out 6 students from the K-2 barrel and 6 students from the 3-6 barrel. If a student's DY Star is pulled out of

the barrel they are awarded a wristband which has the expectation written on it.

These wristbands can then be worn everyday as a part of your child's school uniform. The students are very excited about the wristbands and they are highly sought after. They are proving to be a very successful way of promoting positive behaviour which is respectful, responsible and encourages students to always give their personal best.
